Gift & Vessel ACCEPTANCE POLICY

1. Safe Harbor Haven Inc. d/b/a/ Safe Harbor Boys Home solicits and accepts gifts that are consistent with its mission, vision and values and that support its core programs, as well as special projects
2. Donations will generally be accepted from individuals, partnerships, corporations, foundations or other entities without limitations or from government agencies with limitations.
3. In the course of its regular fundraising activities, the organization will accept donations of money, real property, personal property, stock, and in-kind services.
4. Certain types of gifts must be reviewed prior to acceptance due to the special liabilities they may pose for the organization. Examples of gifts which will be subject to review include gifts of real property, gifts of vessels whether sail or power,
5. Gifts of vessels that are in the water require an organization representative to preview the vessel prior to acceptance, see additional "Vessel Acceptance Policy"

VESSEL ACCEPTANCE POLICY

1. Small trailerable vessels that are within the "scope of use" (see below) within the program will generally be accepted as long as the owner is able to transport them to Safe Harbor. Donations for a trailerable vessel without the trailer and/or motor, vessels that have been submerged, vessels that have not been used for more than 24 months, and those with known problems outside our scope of service will generally be declined.
2. Vessels in the water will be previewed by a representative of the organization prior to acceptance. Determination will be based on condition of vessel and donor's wishes for the vessel and any conditions for the donation to be used within the program or be available for disposal. Acceptance of some in the water donations are conditioned upon the donor's willingness to have the vessel delivered in operable condition to the program.
3. LARGE VESSELS - those over 70 ft and up to 250 tons will be personally inspected by a Senior Staff member prior to acceptance. These vessels will require the donor to deliver the vessel to the program in operable condition prior to execution of donation documents.
4. Vessels over 250 tons will generally not be accepted.

"Scope of Use" - a vessel that is operational and/or repairable within program budget & skills of current personnel. Outside "Scope of Use" - current or former sunken vessels, engines requiring major service/repairs, cracked hulls, absence of major operational parts (transmissions, engines, masts, sails) Inboard/Outboard Vessels that are in the water (these boats crack, leak & boats sink quickly) trailerable vessels with broken trailer leaf springs, flat or rotten tires, those requiring hauling by a tow company and/or on a flat bed
